


The village of Roquebrune-sur-Argens

The church, fountains and porticoes all bear witness to the fascinating past of this thousand-year-old village. The narrow streets and picturesque village squares are the perfect places to go for a stroll and explore the characteristic charm found in the villages of Provence. The recognisable red stone of the rock can be seen behind the Saint-Michel chapel.

Just below this majestic rock of Roquebrune, you'll find the river Argens and the Aréna lake. These natural sites are well known to watersports fans and nature lovers for their biodiversity.





Les Issambres

All roads lead to the sea!

In the gulf of Saint-Tropez, between the sandy beaches, the wild coves and the rocks, the incredible coastline of Les Issambres offers heavenly surroundings. Les Issambres is a peaceful, family-friendly seaside town with a wide range of watersports. Port San Peïre is a great place to go for leisure activities, or to catch one of the 'Bateaux Verts' boats to Saint-Tropez!

The coastal path follows the craggy shoreline for 8 km, in unspoilt natural surroundings amid the scent of pine and the fresh sea

air. The Gallo-Roman fish reservoir, a listed Historical Monument dating from the 1st century, bears witness to the living standards of Roman times.

The themed trails of the Gaillarde valley wind through a forest of strawberry trees, heather and cork oaks, as well as mimosas that bloom in winter. The hills offer a stunning panoramic view extending from the Estérel massif to the Gulf of Saint-Tropez.

In the evening, an incredible sunset colours the horizon between the deep blue of the sea, the pale blue of the sky, the pinkish red of the Estérel mountains and the dark green of the Maures massif.



La Bouverie

Vineyards, prehistoric heritage and mountain walks.

La Bouverie was a region of choice for prehistoric man, amid the hills and umbrella pines. Trodden even in prehistoric times, this land unfurls between scrubland and majestic umbrella pines. There is so much to see in the natural environment here, from lush-green forests to the ochre-coloured cliffs of the Blavet Gorges. In 2022, some new trails were opened for family walks near the Blavet Gorges, making the destination even more appealing.

Harvest time!



A real dilemma! The restaurant owners each add their own personal twist to the iconic dishes of Provence, creating a whole diversity of delicious new flavours.



2.30 pm

Hiking between land and sky

Roquebrune-sur-Argens is a heavenly place for hiking enthusiasts. A multitude of discoveries and challenges await walkers and sports enthusiasts, such as climbing to the top of the rock, 373 metres above sea level, marvelling at the splendour of the Blavet Gorges or recharging your batteries in the fresh sea air of the Mediterranean. You're bound to fall in love with this patchwork of landscapes that leave you in awe and trigger emotions with every step you take.

In 2024, the local council will pursue its undertaking to improve the hiking trails and nature spots. Two new sites will open to the public with the creation or refurbishment of waymarked trails:

The Raphèle site and its heart-shaped lake: By the Blavet Gorges in the Estérel foothills, these easy walks are on mostly flat terrain. Deep in the Mediterranean forest of umbrella pines and cork oaks, you'll see the heart-shaped lake, 'lac de coeur', along the way.

The 25 bridges: In the heart of the Maures mountains, just above the village, there are walks suitable for all levels that tell the story of water in Roquebrune. The 25-bridge aqueduct that carried water to the village of Roquebrune in the 20th century is the best illustration of this.

Sunshine galore!

On a peaceful summer morning, you take to the water on your paddleboard. You head out towards the horizon as the sun rises over the Estérel massif. This is the ideal activity for early birds!

The 8-km coastline of Les Issambres is a succession of beaches, coves and protected natural areas. The local council has been committed to nature preservation for several years now and holds the official title of 'Territoire durable, une COP d'Avance' ('Sustainable region, one COP ahead').

It is also one of the main watersport hotspots, with jet skis, parasailing, seabobs, e-foils, boat rentals with or without a permit, scuba diving, sailing tuition, waterskiing and more. 

Thanks to improvement work carried out in 2023, it is now possible to **walk around the lake**. The 3,5 km walk can be done by anyone, even with a pushchair. A stone's throw from the medieval village, it offers a chance to escape amid unspoilt natural surroundings.

The particularity of « Le Daya » is that it only has 6 rooms, making it the smallest 5-star hotel in France.

Relax in a whirlpool bath or treat yourself to a feel-good massage. Thalassotherapy is an invitation to a journey via the senses in a whole range of treatments, textures and marine fragrances.

So what is thalassotherapy? It is a French concept based on treatments that harness the health-giving benefits of the sea. Seawater holding the secrets to wellbeing is tapped offshore near Peïras beach and used in all the treatments as well as the pool. The thalassotherapy centre of Les Issambres has been reinvented and updated by a number of brands and is now managed by Thalgo. Thalgo, a pioneer in research into the health-giving properties of seawater, has been elaborating creams and treatments for nearly 50 years. Based in Roquebrune-sur-Argens, the factory where Thalgo products are manufactured is one of the biggest exporters in the French department of Var.



Eco-friendly holiday promises

A region one COP ahead:

The Roquebrune-sur-Argens town council has been committed to nature preservation for several years now. The town has obtained the **« Territoire durable »** (sustainable region) accreditation. This recognition rewards its efforts in the field of sustainable development:

- The « Pelagos Sanctuary », Charter for the protection of marine mammals in the Mediterranean,
- The « Zero Plastic Waste », Charter for beaches and the town,
- The « Blue Flag », Ecolabel for the environmental quality of Gaillarde beach, San-Peïre beach and Port San Peïre,
- The « Clean Harbours », signe d'excellence en matière de gestion environnemental des ports de plaisance.

In 2023, the town also achieved the official status of 'Territoires engagés pour la nature **« Territoires engagés pour la nature »**, for a duration of 3 years. This seal of approval from the Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur Regional Agency for Biodiversity and the Environment is awarded to local authorities that take action and implement concrete measures to protect the region's biodiversity.

Clé Verte®:

The **« Green Key® » label** is the first eco-label for holiday accommodation and restaurants that engage in effective environmental approaches to sustainable tourism that is both eco-friendly and socially responsible.

In 2023, Roquebrune-sur-Argens boasted 4 accredited accommodation providers :

- Domaine de la Bergerie (5-star campsite)
- Paradis des campeurs (4-star campsite)
- Pierre & Vacances Les Calanques (4-star holiday apartments)
- Hôtel le Daya (5-star hotel)

In 2024, the Tourist Office is at the side of professionals aiming to obtain this certification.



EVENTS:

Each year, the town enters into partnerships in favour of the environment, or hosts its own events :

- World Clean up Day,
- Journée « Clean up the seabed » with the help of businesses in the nautical sector.


